This week it's all about how restaurants cut corners (and if you look at the comments, add your pet restaurant peeves). The food this week has gone to the dogs-see what I mean below.

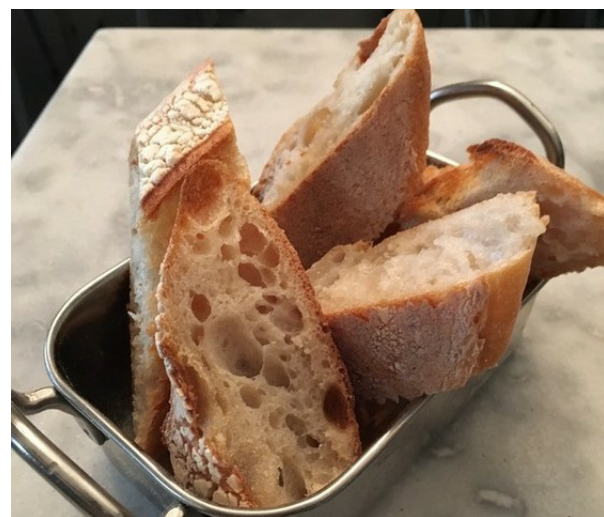
Amazing tulips for the April calendar! If I could find them here, I might risk feeding Bambi and plant some.
